



The following items of business were discussed as per the meeting agenda:

b. Safety moment	<p>JC invited Committee members to share a safety moment.</p> <p>Member discussed the need for more overtaking lanes on the Warrego Highway and the need to take care with additional traffic on the roads during holiday times.</p>	
c. Adoption of minutes	<p>JC asked the Committee to formally consider the 6 September 2013. The 6 September 2013 QCLNG Pipeline Community Committee minutes were adopted.</p>	
d. Actions from previous meeting	<p>JC reviewed the actions from the previous meeting refer attached list.</p>

Community Feedback	<p>JC invited Committee members to share feedback from their networks.</p> <p>Busy at Work:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Member provided positive feedback on support and training for Monto Landcare trainees.</li> </ul> <p>North Burnett Roads</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• North Burnett Shire Council working with QGC to identify roads needing repairs as a result of pipeline activities. Member would like to see matter resolved speedily. <b>ACTION: Member will send list of roads to QGC for follow up with QGC Roads Manager.</b></li> <li>• Member stated Banana Shire is also concerned road agreement outcomes will not be implemented and agreed in timely manner resulting in negative outcome for QGC and local councillors.</li> <li>• Concerns over weed management and spread of weeds query regarding maintenance of ROW. QGC advised regular inspection and maintenance as part of Operations. <b>ACTION QGC to advise what happens to the pipe at the end of the project life and if there is anything outlined in the Environmental Approval.</b></li> <li>• Ongoing frustration of Thangool school bus operator in regards to the school bus curfew breaches.</li> </ul>

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<p><b>j. Consultative Committee</b></p>	<p>Discussion on the future of the group in accordance with the Terms of Reference</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Pipeline Regional Community Committee will be formed just prior to the construction of the QCLNG export pipeline and will operate during the construction of the pipeline, including associated restoration activities. The committee will be dissolved by mutual agreement of the committee members. The ongoing operation of the QCLNG export pipeline will pose minimal impact to communities and any consultation to be completed during this operational phase will be captured by QGC as a part of its ongoing stakeholder engagement process.</li> </ul> <p>The group agreed now the pipe was buried and gas expected in the line by end of the month there was no further need to meet again as a group. They were confident if issues arose they could contact QGC for a response or follow up.</p> <p>The group discussed the benefits of the committee and agreed QGC had met the expectations discussed at the first meeting which were:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Opportunities for community economic development and investment</li> <li>Youth up-skilling</li> <li>Community sustainability</li> <li>Sponsorship of public events</li> <li>Road safety for children</li> <li>Clear, timely communication between QGC and the pipeline communities.</li> </ul> <p>–</p> <p>During the 13 meetings a total of 74 actions had been implemented.</p> <p>The group reflected on their participation with positive comments and feedback provided.</p>
