#### EPBC 2015/7463- ANYA PROJECT

The Anya Project, which authorises the development of 25 CSG coal seam gas wells and associated infrastructure within the project area was approved by the Department of Agriculture, Water and Environment (**DAWE**), on 17 March 2017.

Under EPBC approval 2015/7463 (**the Approval**), the holder of the approval is required to publish an Annual Return addressing compliance with the below conditions on its website within three months of every anniversary of the commencement of the action.

This document is QGC's Annual Return for referral approval, EPBC 2015/7463 – Anya Project for the period from 21 August 2019 to 20 August 2020 (**the Reporting Period**).

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#### 1.0 BACKGROUND

#### 1.1 The Anya Project

The Anya Project is located within an area 30 km west of Dalby Queensland's Surat Basin.

The development comprises 25 wells which is connected by gas and water gathering lines to existing approved QCLNG project infrastructure. In particular, the Field Compressor Station (FCS) and regional storage pond in the neighbouring David block to the west. All gas and water from this development is then be transferred to QGC's existing and approved Ruby Jo Central Processing Plant (CPP) and Kenya Water Treatment Plant (WTP) respectively. All of this infrastructure is already approved and operational (EPBC 2008/4398).

The infrastructure project involves:

- Well development (including construction of a well pad and access tracks, drilling and completion
  of wells and installation of down-hole and surface facilities, potentially including temporary flares);
  and
- Installation of the gathering system (including the trenching or ploughing of a network of gas and water pipelines to collect gas and water produced at each well and transfer it to gas and water management facilities. This may also include installation of fibre-optic and electrical cables).

#### 1.2 Project Activities during the reporting Period

During this reporting period, QGC completed the construction of the infrastructure within Anya Project Area. All wells are currently operational.

Operational activities include:

- Well operation and maintenance;
- Gathering system and maintenance; and
- Access road maintenance.

#### 2.0 CONCLUSION

In compiling this annual return, QGC has not identified any new instances of non-compliance with the conditions of EPBC approval 2015/7463. **Appendix A** of this report provides details of compliance with each of the approval conditions.
